SECTION 1: FORM OF CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT made the 1 day of January 2022

BENJAMIN MKAPA HOSPITAL, P.O.BOX 11088, DODOMA of Tanzania (hereinafter called "the PE") of the one part and M/S BAHARI PHARMACY, P.O BOX 40591, DAR ES SALAAM of Tanzania (hereinafter called "the Supplier") of the other part:

WHEREAS the PE invited Tenders for certain goods and ancillary services, viz., Supply, Installation, Testing, Commissioning Training and Maintenance of Apheresis Machine for Benjamin Mkapa Hospital and has accepted a Tender by the Supplier for the supply of those goods and services in the sum of Tanzania Shillings One Hundred Fifty Million (TZS 150,000,000.00) Vat Exclusive (hereinafter called "the Contract Price").

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this Agreement words and expressions shall have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them in the Conditions of Contract referred to.
- 2. The following documents shall be deemed to form and be read and construed as part of this Agreement, In the event of any ambiguity or conflict between the Contract Documents listed below, the order of precedence shall be the order in which the Contract Documents are listed below:
 - a. This form of contract;
 - b. the Form of Tender and the Price Schedule submitted by the Tenderer;
 - c. the Schedule of Requirements;
 - d. the Technical Specifications
 - e. The Special Conditions of Contract;

- f. the GCC;
- q. the Purchaser's Letter of Acceptance; and
- h. the Certificate of Contract Commencement
- i. the Negotiation minutes
- j. the Power of Attorney
- 3. In consideration of the payments to be made by the PE to the Supplier as hereinafter mentioned, the Supplier hereby covenants with the PE to provide the goods and services and to remedy defects therein in conformity in all respects with the provisions of the Contract
- 4. The PE hereby covenants to pay the Supplier in consideration of the provision of the goods and services and the remedying of defects therein, the Contract Price or such other sum as may become payable under the provisions of the contract at the times and in the manner prescribed by the contract.
- 5. This agreement shall include one year (01) Warranty and one year (01) Comprehensive Maintenance including spare parts from the date of Installation, commissioning, Training and Acceptance of Equipments. **See Appendix**
- 6. The PE hereby covenants to pay the Supplier in consideration of supply of those goods and services in the sum of Tanzania Shillings One Hundred Fifty Million (TZS 150,000,000.00) Vat Exclusive (hereinafter called "the Contract Price").


